Do You have What it Takes? — 6 Characteristics of Great Foster Parents

At any given time in Michigan there are approximately 13,000 children in foster care. Each one of these children needs to be matched to a loving, safe home where they can be cared for as long as they are in foster care.

As you think about all these children needing a loving and safe home, you might be wondering if being a foster parent might be right for you.

There are 6 characteristics of great foster parents:

Heart — Great foster parents are people who really love children. Foster parenting is all about the children! You will really need to have a big heart for children and unselfishly pursue what is best for the children in your care.

Nurturing — You, your household members, and your home environment would need to be healthy, stable, safe, and promote wellbeing, positive growth, and happy experiences for children.

Flexibility — Children require lots of time and attention. You would need to be the professionals involved with the chilavailable to meet with the various professionals working with the children. All children may unexpectedly get sick or have other needs arise that may require you to change your plans. You would need to be able to adjust your way of doing things or your way of thinking about things to better meet the unique needs of the children in your care.

Temperament — You will need to be able to stay self-controlled even when the child is acting out of control. Foster children have already gone through a lot in their short lives and they need the adults in their lives to be patient and caring even when the child is reacting to all the pain and sense of helplessness they feel.

Committed — A foster child has already experienced a lot of loss (parents' good night kiss, home, toys, pets, friends, familiar routines and foods, and other losses). It's important for the foster parent to be a resolved and committed person able to be a support and caregiver to the child as long as needed so the child doesn't have to experience more home transitions and losses than necessary.

Learner — While being a foster parent is extremely rewarding, it is also very challenging. The most successful foster parents are always learning and finding ways to improve their skills. They constantly become better and better at caring for foster children and working with dren.
